

 - Rule 1
 - Don't Hunt and Fish
 - Rule 2
 - Follow the laws and regulations that govern the area you choose to Hunt and Fish at.







Hunting Issues

- Validate your Hunting Permit when you receive it,
- Keep your permit intact-Do not separate the permit until you make a kill,
- If your born after January 1, 1970 have your Hunter Ed Card in your possession while hunting,
- Do not hunt from a vehicle unless you receive special permission from Fish and Wildlife in writing,
- Have a form of identification with you when checked by officers,
- Make sure firearms are unloaded and in a case when in a vehicle,
- Hunting without a permit- Hunting is permitted by permit only. It's a privilegenot a right

Hunting Issues

- Validate the back of your permit when you make a successful kill,
- Do not use another person permit while hunting,
- Do not use artificial light while hunting-Hunting is allowed during daylight hours only. From designated sunrise to sun down hours.
- Do not use alcohol or drugs while hunting.
- Keep camp site cleaner then when you got there.
- Do not possess a firearm while hunting with archery equipment during a archery hunt
- All persons in a hunting party either hunting or assisting a hunter must wear hunter orange during designated hunt that require hunter orange.






Fishing Issues

- No Permit-All fishing require a permit-it's a privilege to fish-not a right,
- Littering ,
- Failure to comply with Fishing Permit requirements,
- Using live Bait-minnows are not allowed,
- Using live gold fish as bait,
- Catching fish by netting,
- Snagging Fish
- Possession of Alcohol or drugs
- No second rod validation
- Using kids as decoy so you don't receive a citation for no permit.

- While fishing be honest with game wardens,
- If the people you are with walk off from your location have them put there equipment away,
- Fishing is a privilege, its not a right.
- Navajo Nation Permits are required for taking any wildlife off of Navajo Nation lands.,
- Know the rules and regulation that cover fishing, it is your responsibility to know these laws if you plan to fish.





Boating:

- Know your boating requirements
- Always follow coast guard rules for equipment on your boats.
- Always have an adult present with children under 16 in a boat
- Know the weight limit of the craft
- Always have everyone wear a life jacket
- Be aware of the weather while on a boat.
- Gas motors are not permitted on Navajo Nation Lakes except Morgan Lake.
