CONDITIONS:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• SPLIT SEASON DATES: (Any 30 days) September 1 to October 15, 2020 and January 1 to February 15, 2021• HUNT UNITS OPEN: 1-16• Use of aircraft prohibited• Use of snow mobiles and all-terrain vehicles prohibited (exception, Sec. 2.20, Hunting and Trapping Regulations)• There is a mandatory permit check in and out• A licensed Navajo Nation guide is required and must accompany the hunter any time he/she is on Navajo Nation lands, including during scouting activities prior to the hunt. The Department of Fish and Wildlife is not responsible for arrangements made between a guide and a client, and the quality of guide services provided.• No hunter companions, except for immediate family members• No refunds• Permit cannot be transferred• The successful bidder must also submit a completed Navajo Nation Hunt Application in order for permit to be printed• Successful bidder must be eligible to hunt on the Navajo Nation• The successful hunter must have their elk checked by Department personnel to collect harvest information. Failure to do so will result in the hunter being ineligible for three years.• 10% of the proceeds will be retained by NGA.• The NGA will pay the remaining 90% of the proceeds to the Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife.
