

NAVAJO MASTER ANGLER PROGRAM

The Navajo Master Angler Award Program challenges anglers with catching one or all of the fish species that are outlined in the official rules of this program. To participate in the Navajo Master Angler Program, you do not have to be a resident of the Navajo Nation. To be eligible, fish must be taken legally in Navajo Nation waters that are open to the public. Fish taken as a part of this program must be taken from waters as described above and must meet or exceed the minimum size. You must also have a valid Navajo Nation fishing license and abide by all rules and regulations for waters in which you are fishing. A side-view color photo of the fish on a measuring board or next to a tape measure must be provided. Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife is granted permission to use any image(s) provided. To be entered, you must measure your catch and fill out the application in the link below. Once verified, you will receive a certificate. There is no limit on the number of fish that you can submit for this award. Pictures may also be emailed to gselby@nndfw.org.
